12/20/04 - IMPROVED TEAM ACCOUNTING

With the advice and help of the staff, and SSA CFO Alan Gleason in Hobbs, and Team Treasurer Doug Jacobs, the US Team has established separate financial accounts for the purpose of managing US Team funds. The prior approach involved co-mingling of Team funds with SSA funds, which could have led to confusion among contributors as to the utilization of their gifts. Separate accounts, with all funds designated for the Team being segregated, and all expenses paid under the authority of the US Team Treasurer, should address this perception. The SSA staff will continue to assist the US Team Committee with accounting and transaction support.

12/17/04 - TEAM ESTABLISHES NEW CONTRIBUTION CATEGORY

In 2004 the US team sponsored two training and performance camps all pilots including the Juniors. More of these camps in the planning stages for the 2005 season. Harris Hill Soaring Corporation and the US Soaring Team Announce a Junior Cross Country Soaring Development Camp The Harris Hill Soaring Corporation (HHSC) will host a Junior Cross Country Development Camp July 6 – 9, 2005 at Harris Hill, Elmira, NY. Ground and flying cross-country instruction will be offered to Junior soaring pilots who are ready to begin, or in the initial stages of, cross country soaring. Instruction will be available both in two seater gliders,



and in single seat gliders (lead and follow). Camp instructors have extensive experience in cross country soaring and competition at the regional and national level. Applicants must be age 25 or less and have completed their glider solo flight. Preference will be given to those holding the Private Glider license and the Silver Duration and Altitude Badges. As many of you may know, the SSA is represented to the FAI/IGC only through our "national aero club", the NAA in Washington, which represents all US air sports. Unfortunately, the NAA plays no active role to assist us in any way, and requires substantial annual dues payments while providing no added value. This has been a long-standing issue of contention at the SSA Board. The Team Committee and SSA Board members are working to address these fees. 
09/22/04 - US TEAM COMMITTEE TO MEET IN DENVER

The US Team Committee members Dianne Black-Nixon, Doug Jacobs, Tim Welles, Ken Sorenson, John Seaborn and SSA Executive Director Dennis Wright will be meeting in conjunction with the SSA Board of Directors meeting in Denver, Colorado the weekend of October 16, 2004. Agenda items include discussion of the 2005 Junior Team, financial review, fundraising for the 2006 campaigns (Multi-Class, Club, World), team selection, committee elections, 2005 SSA Convention and several other items.

09/05/04 - LEGENDARY SOARING PILOT AJ SMITH DIES AT AGE 80

The United States and the world soaring community lost a giant in the history of competition soaring on September 5th of 2004 with the passing of Andrew James Smith. AJ passed away with heart failure at age 80 in his home in Tecumseh, Michigan. He began soaring in the 1950s with fellow competitor and friend Dick Schreder in the Adrian, Michigan and Toledo, Ohio area. He quickly focused on competition soaring and preceded to modify each of his sailplanes for enhanced performance beginning with the LO-150 and continuing through the Sisu 1A, ASW12, and Glasflugel 604. He won the Open Class Nationals in each of these planes from the early 60's to 1980. AJ

represented the USA on four international teams:



England "65," Poland "68," Marfa TX "70," and Yugoslavia "72." He was the second American to win a World Gliding Championship in Leszno, Poland, flying an Elfe S-3 in the Standard Class. In 1968, AJ was inducted into the Soaring Hall of Fame. AJ served as an SSA director for more than 15 years.



AJ was a very successful architect in the Detroit area, owning his own major firm (Smith and Gardner) that designed many award-winning structures from airport terminals to major office complexes across the US. AJ's artistic flare from his architecture background, combined with his engineering knowledge of sailplane aerodynamics, enabled him to design an extremely efficient racing airplane in the early 80's which rocked the racing world of the Experimental Aircraft Association. The plane - the AJ-2 - was designed to compete in a new efficiency race the Oshkosh 500

sponsored by the EAA. The plane dominated the race from its first entry in 1981 and each succeeding year for seven years. The sponsors of the race eventually changed the rules, rendering the plane no longer competitive - the plane is now headed to the Smithsonian Smithsonian's Air and Space Museum.

AJ grew up in Tecumseh and graduated from Tecumseh High School in 1942. After high school, AJ began

working for NACA (now NASA) as a model builder at Langley Field, Virginia. He then served in the Navy during WWII, flying Corsairs off aircraft carriers for two years in the Atlantic. From 1946-1951 he attended the University of Michigan acquiring an architectural engineering degree. Although AJ had not been active in soaring for several years, he always stayed abreast of the competition scene and the development of newgeneration sailplanes. His heart was - and will always be - with the competition soaring pilot. - By Dick Butler

It also featured presentations by Tim Hanke and Erik Nelson who spoke very well about their experiences as Junior Team pilots. 08/20/04 US TEAM MEMBERS AND 2004 TEAM SELECTION

With the conclusion of the Open, 18-Meter and Standard Class Nationals this year's team selection has drawn to a

close. According to revised team selection policy a selected pilot must participate in their respective pre-worlds or requalify for the team at next years nationals. Dick Butler, already selected for the 2006 Multi-Class Team (Sweden) in the 15-meter class and top ranked in the open class has opted to accept the 2006 Open Class team position. Dick intends to participate in the 2005 Pre-Worlds in Sweden. Subsequently there will be no 15-meter team selection in 2004 so two 15-meter pilots will be selected for a five pilot WGC 06 Multi-Class team at the 2005 nationals in Uvalde. Ray Gimmey was selected to the 2006 Multi-Class Team in the Standard Class based on the results of the Standard Class Nationals in Hobbs and his previous team standings. Ray has not yet decided if he will attend the 2006 Pre-Worlds in Sweden. There are a couple of standard class selection scenarios possible for 2005 depending on pre-world participation and the overall team size allowed by the Swedish organizers. Currently the organizers have approved a five pilot team and if Ray attends the Pre-Worlds in 2005 no additional Standard class selections will be done. If a larger six pilot team is permitted by the organizers one or two Standard Class team selections will be made in 2005. Rick Walters has been selected to the 2006 Multi-Class team in the 18-meter class and has opted to participate in the 2005 Pre-Worlds. Only one 18-meter pilot will be selected for the 2006 team. Junior pilot Chris Saunders was selected to participate on the 2005 Junior Team based on his scores at the national level. Chris has not yet decided to participate in this event with what would be his team mate **Garret Willat**. To round out this years team section as reported earlier US Team Committee Chairman Doug Jacobs has notified Club Class pilot David Stevenson and World Class pilot Francois Pin of

their qualifying status. Both of these pilots intend to participate in their 2004 Pre-Worlds in France. One or more pilots will be selected from these classes in 2005. 03/06/04 FAI UPDATES SPORTING CODE INCLUDES NEW ANTI-DOPING SECTION

On 1st April 2004, the new edition of the FAI Sporting Code, General Section, comes into force. This contains new rules on doping (paragraph > 3.11.2.). An entirely new document has also been produced entitled: FAI Anti-Doping Rules and Procedures. The FAI will be issuing a new edition of the FAI Sporting Code including new rules regarding Anti-Doping. These new rules are very strict. Penalties can include disqualification and sanction. Review of the material at the web links below is mandatory for current team members and recommended for potential team members. There are forms to be filled out, rules and procedures to know, lists of banned substances and other information on the subject. All those who intend to participate in FAI sporting events should consult the documents on this site. In particular, they must refrain from consuming the substances listed on the World Anti-Doping Agency's Prohibited List.
