09/27/05 - NEW ZEALAND GRAND PRIX JANUARY 2006

Following on the highly successful initial staging of the IGC's new "regatta style" Grand Prix racing format at St. Auban this past summer, Gliding New Zealand has announced the organization of a similar event at Omarama, NZ for the period January 21-29, 2006. As recent IGC deliberations indicate that the Grand Prix format will become permanent, this will be a qualifying event for the 2nd World Sailplane Grand Prix in 2007. Chip Garner and Tim McAllister participated in the St. Auban event, and their experiences with the new format were ably chronicled by the official web site, as well as Susan McAllister's excellent blog site. **One pilot**

per nation will be accepted, and the organizers intend to supply Standard Class gliders to foreign



participants. John Coutts, reigning World 15 Meter Champion, will represent New Zealand. The organizers intend to cover the cost of return airfare, lodging, and meals, making this exceedingly affordable for participants. A copy of the invitation is available here in PDF format. The official New Zealand Gliding Web site is here. The US Team Committee has indicated to Gliding New Zealand that we would like to send a pilot to this event, but that we have not yet developed formal selection policies for this new racing format. Instead, as with the St. Auban contest, the Team Committee is issuing an open invitation to pilots seeded ranked in the US Open, 15 Meter, 18 Meter, Standard, and Sports classes who wish to participate. Selection will be based on the 2005 US Rankings for International Team Selection. In case of ties, the participant will be selected from the class with the largest number of participants in the Nationals during the ranking years. See the Grand Prix ranking list here. 09/27/05 - REVISION TO 2006 MULTI-CLASS TEAM SELECTION

The US Team Committee was recently advised by IGC representative Eric Mozer that an error had been made by the organizers of the 2006 29th World Gliding Championship in their communications to the Committee and to other national teams. Previously the Committee had been advised that the IGC had approved a national team size of 5 pilots with one reserve pilot, an overall limit of 120 pilots, and a limitation of 1 pilot per class in Open and 18 Meter. In response to an inquiry made by the Organizers, the IGC minutes of the 2003 meeting in Prague were reexamined. It was determined that no restrictions on the Open and 18 Meter were set, other than a maximum of two pilots per country in any class. As noted above, the Team Committee therefore made a good faith error in selecting Chip Garner from the Standard Class as 6th/Reserve pilot despite US team selection rules which call for the sixth pilot to be selected from the 18-Meter Class. In light of this erroneous information the Committee agreed that we had no alternative but to follow US selection rules in this case, despite the embarrassment of rescinding Chip's selection. He has been so advised, and agreed that our decision was the correct one. At this point the organizers are being very careful about the question of a sixth pilot so that they are sure the 120 pilot limit will not be exceeded. Next in the 18 Meter Class are Sam Zimmerman and Rick Indrebo. The Team Committee will likely hold off on formal

selection at this point until receiving a formal confirmation that a sixth pilot will be accepted. The Committee regrets this error, thanks Chip for his understanding and apologizes to all concerned. - *Doug Jacobs*, *US Team Committee Chairman*

Highly ranked pilots **David Mockler** and **Gary Ittner** finished one and two in Uvalde and have been selected to represent the United States in the 15-Meter Class at the 2006 World Gliding Championships in Sweden. Rounding out the team will be **Doug Jacobs** and **Chip Garner** in the Standard Class, **Rick Walters** in the 18-Meter Class and **Dick Butler** in the Open Class. Club Class pilot **Tim McAllister** will join **David Stevenson** on the 2006 Club Class team while **Pat Tucky** will be **François Pin's** teammate on the 2006 World Class team. 08/14/05 - SIX TO SWEDEN IN 06, IGC SAYS STANDARD CLASS

The US Team Committee received an important update to the local rules for WGC'06 in Eskilstuna, Sweden from organizer and past World Champion Goran Ax. Subject to an overall maximum limit of 120 pilots, the contest will now accept up to six, rather than five pilots as previously published. However, under the specifications promulgated by the IGC in its approval for the venue, only single entries per country will be accepted in the 18 meter and Open Classes, with multiple entries allowed in Standard and 15 meter Classes. The US Team Selection Rules specify that a pilot for each class is selected first, and second pilots are selected in order from the most to the least populous class until all slots are filled. Based on current participation rates in the past several years, this would indicate that our fifth pilot should be selected from 15 meter class, and our sixth from 18 meter. While we requested that we be allowed to substitute an 18 meter slot for a second Standard slot, the organizers can not accommodate us under current IGC rules. This was confirmed to us by our representative to the IGC, Eric Mozer. The US Team Committee met in Uvalde on August 7 and decided to send a sixth pilot to Sweden, and in compliance with the IGC position, select that pilot from Standard Class. Our Team will there for consist of 2 - Standard, 2 - 15 meter, 1 - 18 meter, and 1 - Open Class. Based on finalized scores from the 2005 Standard Class Nationals and previous years, Chip Garner is therefore selected to the World Team. Congratulations to Chip. - Doug Jacobs, Chairman U.S. Team Committee.

In conjunction with the Philadelphia Glider Council, the US Team sponsored Cross – Country Camp in early June. Led by Team members Doug Jacobs, Karl Striedieck, and John Good, the Camp targeted qualified pilots ready to cut the cord to the home field, or those who wanted to extend their reach to longer distances. With several Duo Discus and Twin Grob's, all participants had an opportunity to fly dual with accomplished cross country racers and see how a typical cross country flight unfolds in action, as well as fly their own ships with seasoned pilots in small groups on hounds-and-fox missions. While the weather was a challenge the daily routine included lectures, weather and task briefings, lots of flying, and GPS-trace debriefings at the end of the day. Also available is ground-school only participation.

07/19/05 - GRAND PRIX UPDATE

Champions Chip Garner and Tim McAllister will be representing the United States at the upcoming Grand Prix in France. From the organizers... "The Sailplane Grand Prix is a new type of gliding competition, more easy to understand for the public and more attractive for the media. It is based on rules, which are simpler than those of conventional competitions. All sailplanes start simultaneously (regatta start, have to complete relatively short tasks with turn points set over the airfield or over easily accessible mountains and the winner will be the first pilot completing the task. The overall ranking will be made using place scoring like in Formula 1 Car Racing. The sailplanes will carry tracking units broadcasting their GPS position down to the ground so that the spectators will be able to watch the race in real time. The First World Sailplane Grand Prix, which will take place on the Saint Auban airfield place from 2 to 11 September 2005, will be the first World Championship run according to these new rules. It will gather the 20 best glider pilots in the World and every day there will be spectacular races with high speed finishes at the airfield." No team funding is available for this event. 01/20/05 - LAWRENCE WOOD LONG TIME TEAM SUPPORTER DIES

Lawrence Wood was born December 7, 1918 at Refugio, Texas. He passed away on January 5, 2005 after a short illness. His father Richard Henry Wood, and his mother, Carrie Lambert Wood, were of Texas families with deep Irish roots. Interested in engineering and business administration, Wood joined Braniff Airways of Dallas, Texas after College. In 1940, he began a short but varied two years as co-pilot instructor, and administrator and became involved in the engineering aspects of airport design and construction. In 1942, his experience with the airlines led to the rank of Captain and Pilot. Following the entry of the United States into World War II he became associated with the Contract Carrier division - Air Transport Command. Transferred in 1943, Mr. Wood became instructor of Army/Air Force transportation crews. In 1947, after the War and another brief stint with Branifff, he returned to Refugio. Lawrence Wood continued his association with flying through the years. He was one of the organizers of the Refugio Soaring Circle and served several years as a Director of the Soaring Society of America as a past President. In 1986 he received the Soaring Society of America's highest award - The Warren E. Eaton Memorial. The Lawrence Wood Fund was established in 1997 by donating his personal Nimbus 3DT to the US Team Soaring Committee to show his support of this effort. The U.S. Team Soaring Committee elected to sell the aircraft on the open market and to apply all proceeds over \$100,000 for the benefit of the 1997 U.S. Team. The corpus of \$100,000 was used to establish an honorary fund in the name of Lawrence Wood. Interest accrued by the Lawrence Wood Fund will be made available to the U.S. Soaring Team. He attended the Nationals in Uvalde last August spoke with Mark Huffstutler about doing some flights in a Ximingo motorglider. He loved soaring and dreamt of it until his death.
