NEWS BRIEF - June 2, 2004

Hello Race Fans! Greetings from Elverum, Norway!

It's a bright sunny morning here on Wednesday, June 2nd. I arrived on Monday night, but my husband, Tim, has been here for almost two weeks competing as a guest in the Norwegian National Championships. He won the last two days (Contest day 3 and 4) of the Club Class. Day 3 was a 414 km (257 mile) Racing Task, and the pilots spent between seven and nine hours in the cockpit. The weather was challenging, as the task gave pilots a tour of the far north (read – mountainous) part of the task area. Day 4 was a 379 km (235 mile) Racing Task with beautiful cloudstreets everywhere, and much higher speeds in the 90 km/h (56 mph) range.



Tim has been quite impressed with the flying and with the fine hospitality of our Norwegian hosts. Everyone, both at the airfield and in the town of Elverum, has

Excitement is beginning to build here. The contest site, which is called Starmoen, is really buzzing with activity. Last minute painting, cleaning, and organizing seems to be happening everywhere you look. This morning, I watched the workers putting up 24 flag poles for the flags of each participating nation. At these



moments, you realize what an honor it is to be representing your country in international competition.



Other Teams are already arriving: on Monday night the Austrian team arrived and set up their Gemütlich (cozy) camp, and yesterday we met the Australian team manager and the New Zealand team. Two of the British team members arrived late in the day. The U.S. Team will be complete when our two other team members, Bob Barber and Manfred

Franke, arrive with their crews at the end of the week.

The actual Unofficial Training Period begins on the 6th, but people are already flying in this "pre-unofficial" training week. The official training will take place from the 9th - 11th, and the opening ceremonies will include a parade through town and a chicken barbeque on the 12th. On the 13th, the contest will begin.

Aviation aircraft, including this 1944 Fairchild M62 trainer, arrived at Starmoen for this annual event. The M62s were used by the Norwegian Air Force in Canada during World War II to train pilots. Ole Reistad, for whom this gliding center is named, led the effort to bring these trainers to Norway after the war and distribute them to flying clubs around the country. This particular aircraft is called "The Spirit of Little Norway," and its is shown next to a DeHaviland Tiger Moth.

Country and Contest Site



Elverum/Starmoen, the home of the 3rd Club Class World Gliding Championships, is located 147 km northeast from the centre of Oslo, the Capital of Norway. Gliding over the Norwegian countryside is an incredible experience. Located at 60 degrees north latitude, the Norwegian summer brings long hours of daylight, allowing gliding under the "midnight sun" (even if you have to go 700 km to the north to see the sun at midnight proper). The thermals start early in the morning, and often last until

20:00 hrs. The thermal conditions are good with a generally high cloud bases. More information on the weather conditions can be found on the weather page. Visibility of 50 to 100 km and above is not unusual on sunny days. The conditions are often perfect for long distance flights. The airspace is generally free of restrictions, with only the Oslo / Gardermoen TMA to the south-west of the task area.
